# From the First Vice Chair Too Many Groups

Tradition Three reminds us, "Any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an AA group, provided that . . . they have no other affiliation."

Why are new groups started? Some say all that's needed to form an AA group is resentment and a coffee pot. While this is true on one level, it perhaps falls short of considering what may be best for AA as a whole, the important but often disregarded latter part of Tradition Four.

While the growth in AA membership has remained relatively flat in recent years, there has been growth in the number of groups and meetings. This is certainly true in Nassau. The result is that our groups are becoming smaller. Where there may have been one or two relatively large groups meeting in a given community, now there may be several smaller ones. Participation at any one meeting may be small even if local groups do not meet on the same days or at the same times. Each group needs to pay rent, buy supplies and literature and perhaps keep insurance. Each needs to handle Twelve Step calls. offer sponsorship to newcomers, field a team of officers and, hopefully, representatives to the service structure. The smaller the participation, the more challenged the group may be to do these things; the more difficult it may be for the group to be fully self-supporting and effective. Competition among groups for member participation and member dollars may not be healthy for the Fellowship as a whole.

A group struggling for survival may want to consider merging with another similarly struggling local group. In starting a new group or meeting, consider, is there a real AA-based need in terms of Tradition Five? Do groups already meet in the community or nearby? If I'm unhappy with my group for whatever reason, perhaps the challenge is to stick around, and to try to effect positive change. I may find considerable personal growth in staying the course at home.
